Career Relay

Objective: To understand and appreciate that even the most common events, products, occurrences have a myriad of associated careers/jobs; and that many careers/jobs intersect and have relationships.

Supplies:

Markers

Whiteboard or large sheets of paper

Procedure:

- Divide students into teams.
- Decide how much time you will allow for the activity (3 5 minutes).
- On whiteboard or large sheets of paper, write the name of an event (i.e., Super Bowl, 4th of July Parade, Circus, Birthday Party, Olympics, County Fair), product (i.e., Cheese, Bicycle, iPod), or some other occurrence (i.e., having a pet, summer school, camping, etc.) (Keep this hidden until instructions are given and everyone is ready to play.)
- Instruct participants to think of and record as many occupations as they can think of that are associated with the event/product/occurrence listed.
- Give a marker to the first person on each team. One person at a time is to record their response, and then pass the marker to the next person in line, and so on.
- On "Go," the relay begins.
- At "stop," the relay ends.

Process Out:

- Have students look at the lists they created.
- Talk about the many jobs associated with a single event/product or occurrence.
- Discuss the inter-connectedness of careers and how they span across industries and career clusters.

Extensions of Activity

- Pick event/product/occurrence based on course/unit specific content
- Sort and categorize jobs listed based on:
 - skills needed,
 - o possible interests that may be associated with this occupation,
 - career cluster/pathway,
 - position or place on career ladder,
- Have student select and research one of the jobs generated through this activity
